## WHAT IS A TED TALK?

A TED Talk is a short, powerful talk (18 minutes or less). They used to be mainly on Technology, Entertainment and Design (Hence TED) but are now on every subject you can think of. The talks are usually done by leaders in their fields at conferences and then recorded for anyone to see.

## HOW DO I CHOOSE A TED TALK?

There are now thousands of TED talks online in multiple topics so how do you choose the best one for your personal statement? Start off by using the topic drop down to select the topic most closely relating to your degree of choice (you can use the A-Z guide in the main booklet for this). Then scroll through to see which talk looks most interesting to you.

You can also look through topics covered in your degree on course pages and search for those too so your examples are extra relevant!

I was also motivated by the way in which he presented to an audience; it made me realise how liberating it would be to pass my knowledge onto others as a future undergraduate.”



Don't forget your A B C's. Like Point, Evidence, Explain in English, we can use the acronym **ABC** to ensure we have covered everything in our super curricular example:

**A** Activity



**B** Benefit



**C** Course
