Challenge of Inclusive Methods Under Covid-19 Pandemic

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My project investigates how people perceive and control risk which requires understanding of the cultural value. Qualitative data production such as face-to-face interview and participant observation, living in the community and building relationship over prolonged period of time, allow me to determine what matters to other people. 'Inclusive' approach embraces such methods aspiring to be included in the 'native' community and see the world the way they see. 'Involvement' means building trust relationship, taking responsibility as the member and prioritising the physical safety of the people with whom I work. COVID19 is a significant barrier to adopt fully ethnographic methods I intended. This poster addresses some of the work-arounds that became necessary not only to protect my informants from possible health risks, but also to ensure that I was not *seen* to be posing a health risk to local people.
