HOLIDAYS

Gentle Guided Walking Holiday at Church Stretton 5-9th October 2026

Our Holiday in 2026 will be at the Long Mynd, Church Stretton in the Shropshire Hills. This is a Monday to Friday holiday with walks on the Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. On this holiday we will have gentle guided walks with HF Leaders and they will provide transport to and from the walks. Long Mynd is in Church Stretton, not far from Iron Bridge, Ludlow and Shrewsbury. The Postcode is SY6 6AG.

Long Mynd is HF's largest house and has recently had a £4million upgrade. Long Mynd was originally built as a spa hotel above the village, with panoramic views over the Stretton Hills. It will certainly be more comfortable and smarter than Abingworth. We have booked 36 places, which is not the whole house and we expect to share with other walking groups. We are using the Gentle Guided walking programme again with 3 slower paced walks ranging from $3\frac{1}{2}$ to $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Church Stretton is well connected with bus services on the B5477. If you would like to come as a non-walker, please let us know.

The cost of the holiday is currently quoted at £595 per person. All rooms are en suite. The price includes bed, breakfast, packed lunch for everyone and an evening meal. The distance from Norwich is about 200 miles via the A14 and M6 around Birmingham. We will organise a coach from Norwich if there are enough takers and share the cost between all the passengers.

We have booked 36 places with HF. Early booking as a Group has great benefits for us with discounts! There are no single supplements. However, we do have to pay our deposits very early to secure the necessary classic rooms and limited single rooms. Later bookings will be subject to HF availability, especially singles. A deposit of £75 is needed, with the booking form to secure your booking. The booking form is on a separate sheet at the end of this newsletter.

Please do ensure you have appropriate travel insurance. If you need to cancel for any reason, you will lose your deposit. The final balance will be due at the beginning of August 2026 and is not refundable.

Tuesday, 28 October 2025 'Norfolk Citizens Advice - a practical guide' - David Stephenson

Why does Citizens Advice exist? How does Norfolk Citizens Advice function? What does it do? Who does it help? How has it changed? In addition to answering these questions, there will be a practical session to enable you to use the Citizens Advice resources to support yourself and others. Jim and his partner Clare established the Walnut Tree Nursery in south Norfolk in 1998, selling rare and unusual hardy garden plants. He has a degree in Environmental Science and has worked in International Conservation.

His talk explores the history and purpose of botanical gardens, illustrated with beautiful images throughout, and then takes a closer look at a handful of gardens, from far distant continents to the world-class Royal Botanic Gardens Kew and the easily accessible University of Cambridge Botanic Garden.

Tuesday, 27 January 2026 'Ink in my Blood'- Neil Haverson

The history of the Eastern Daily Press from its launch in the 19th century with a look at my 50+ year career in the newspaper industry and the publication of my memoir "Ink in My Blood."

Tuesday, 24 February 2026 'Bedrooms, Banquets and Balls – the English Country House' – John Vigar

This off-beat and amusing look at the development of the English Country House takes as its starting point the medieval Hall-House and follows architectural tastes and fashions to the mid twentieth century. It looks at the architecture of the houses, their furnishings and the way in which the rooms were used in different periods.

We also hear about the people who lived in these buildings – many of them eccentric and memorable – and discover the ways in which their whims fashioned the houses we see today. We will hear about exploding cakes, tight mistresses and exotic princes.

John Vigar was personally encouraged early in his career by John Betjeman and is a Trustee of a national charity of which Betjeman was a founder. He is an architectural historian by profession. He also lectures for several universities and colleges and until his retirement worked for The Churches Conservation Trust.

All talks begin at 2.15pm (unless otherwise stated) in the Costessey Centre, Longwater Lane, Costessey (NR8 5AH).

This walk is approximately 5 miles long mainly on well trodden paths through Mousehold Heath, taking in some of the historical landmarks. There are no stiles and there will be opportunities for anyone wishing to walk less on the day. Lunch for those that want it will be at the Cottage pub in Thorpe St Andrew. The walk will start from outside Britannia barracks where there is free parking on the road outside the barracks and in the car park opposite.

UEA Retirement Association: Privacy Statement

What information do we hold about you and where does it come from?

The information we hold about you is taken from the membership application form which you complete each year. On that form we ask for your name, address, telephone number and email address so that we can contact you for the purposes set out below. Also, for joint membership, we ask for the name of your spouse/partner.

Who has access to this information and how is it used?

The information you provide is held confidentially by the Executive Committee and is used, for example:

as a basis for distributing the copies of Renaissance that members receive during the year;

as a basis for publishing notices to wider groups of members;

by Group Organisers to contact participants of the interest group concerned;

by Outing or Holiday Organisers to contact participants in an outing or Holiday.

Communication with you may be via any of the contact details you choose to give us on your membership form but for speed and convenience, as well as cost, the Committee uses email where possible, rather than letter post or telephone, to notify members of important events, notices, holidays and confirmation of outing bookings.

No data will be shared with any other organisation or individuals without your permission (other than Executive Committee members and RA members who organise activities of the kind noted above, where needed for the purpose of contacting members who participate in those activities).

How long will we hold the information about you?

We will hold your information for as long as you continue to be a member of the Association. Membership is renewed annually and the data we hold about you will be updated each year from your membership form or during the year, if you advise us of changes to your details. If we do not receive a renewal form from you we will retain the information we already hold about you for up to one year. If we do not hear from you by the time of the next annual renewal date we will delete your details.

Your rights

Data Protection legislation gives you a range of rights in relation to your personal data including access, amendment, erasure and restricting how it is used. Information about your rights can be seen on the Information Commissioner's website. To advise us of updates or other requests in relation to the information we hold about you please contact the Membership Secretary (Keith Woods).

From the 25th May 2018, new General Data Protection Regulations mean we will need your consent to hold and store data on our members and to communicate with them in a manner which has their consent, and which is in line with UK law on data protection.
