



We want videos that show
















or disagreement about something.



The video will be about half a minute to one minute long.




The video clips will be part of our online guidance.





Capacity difficulties - Finding it difficult to think what something means to you, to remember it, and to make a decision.

Communication difficulties - Finding it difficult to understand what people say and to say what you think.

Practitioner – a person who practices something specific. For example, a medical doctor or psychologist Focus group – a group of people that discuss a particular topic together

Advisory group – a group of people who gives us advice for our project

Recruitment – inviting people to take part in research
Research Design Service – experts who work with
researchers to design studies

**Research Ethics Committee** – teams who read research proposals and say whether it is safe and sound or not work.

**Health Research Authority** – the group that protects and promotes safe research.
