BEFORE CHOOSING LEVEL 2 COURSES

Research if specific subjects or grades



For example, think about what course you might like to study. Then, on the University website, look at the entry criteria required. You may see a statement like, 'You'll need

Deadlines

Sometimes you need to select specific Level 3 subjects to study the university course you want to do in the future. Not all Level 3 subjects are accepted for each university course. Less common


options are not always shown on course webpages, so in these cases you should contact the University's admissions department.


in a BTEC in Health, Care or Science'.
