Notes from the Treasurer

Membership Renewals 2025

Thank you all for renewing your 2025 memberships so promptly. The exercise is now completed and any members whose membership has lapsed do not receive this Renaissance. A few facts and figures are below(the figures in brackets are the comparable figures for 2024): -

172 (175) members renewed by 31 December 2024 with a few paying in January, so it was only necessary to send 30 (23) reminders to jog memories. On 26 January membership was 189 (182) which represents 81 (76) individual members and 54 (53) joint members.

It is encouraging to note that we have had several new members joining in recent months and the decline in total membership has been halted.

Walking and Exploring the South Downs at Abingworth 6-10 October 2025

We do have a few spaces if any non-walkers would like to join us to explore the South Downs. You will have full board, an en-suite room and can join the activities in the evening. We cannot provide day-time activities, but there is plenty to do in the area, especially with a bus pass and cards for National Trust etc. Abingworth is about 10 miles from Worthing and 20 miles from Chichester and Goodwood. And you'll have an HF packed lunch too! Do contact us if you'd like more details.

On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday we will have fully guided "Gentle Walks", from 4 to 9 miles with HF Leaders and they will provide transport to and from the walks.
