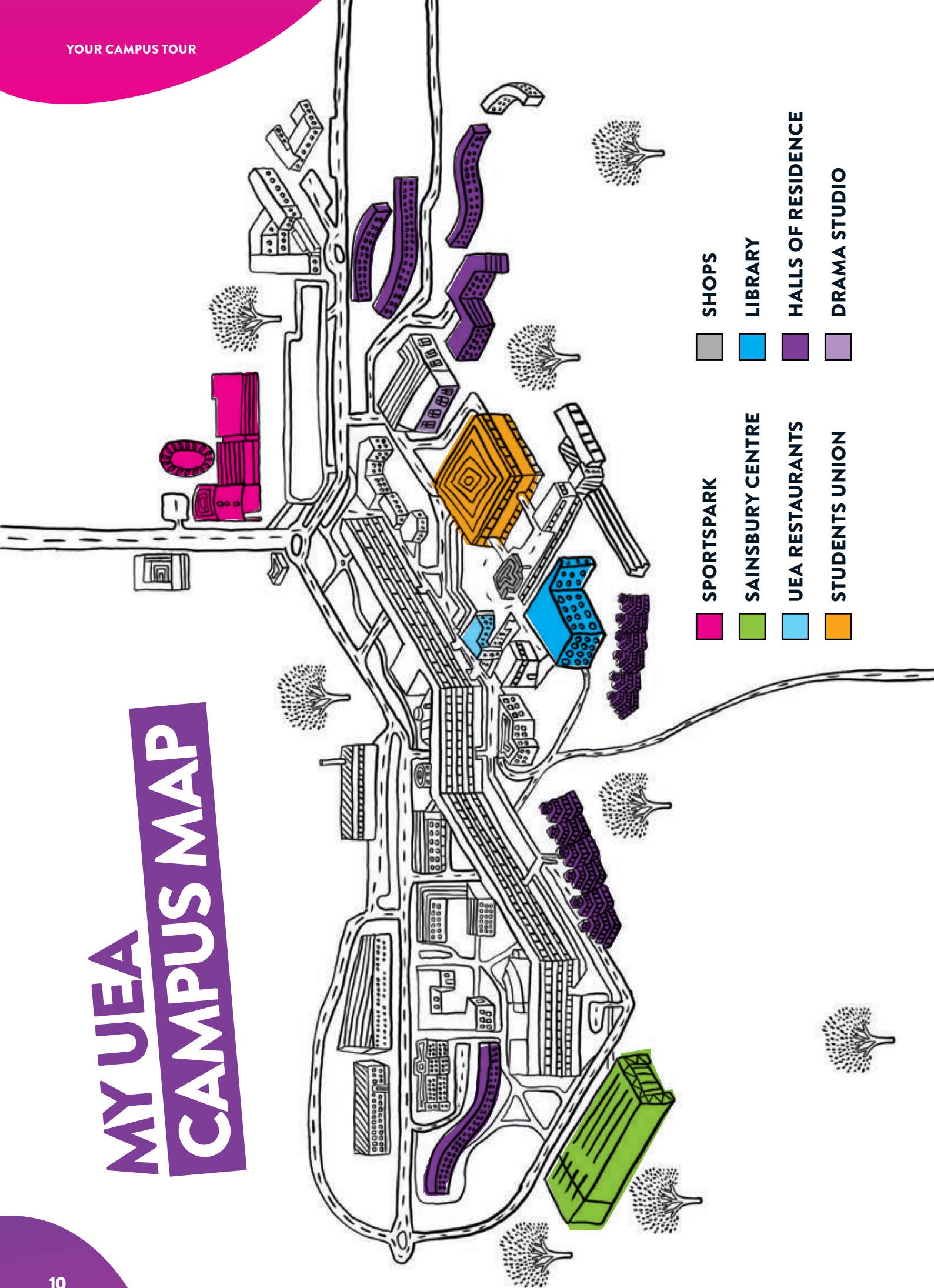

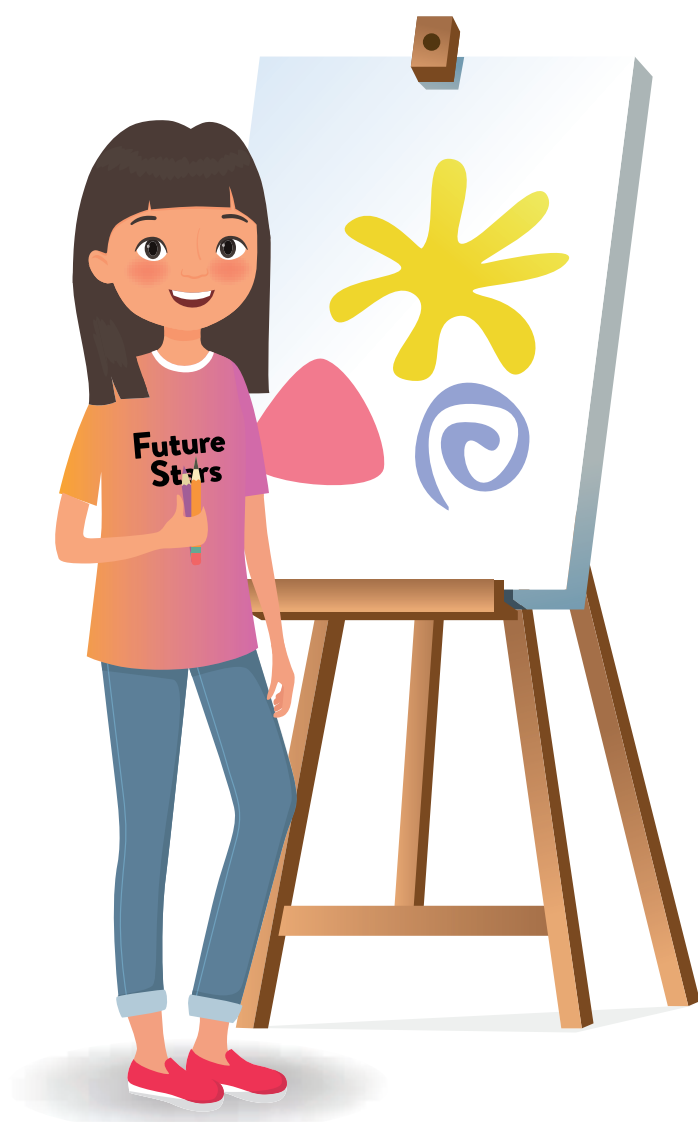
WHAT CAN I DO WITH MY SUBJECTS?

Have you ever thought about what your favourite school subject could lead to in the future? The things you enjoy learning now can turn into exciting new subjects at secondary school, fascinating courses at university, and even real jobs when you're an adult.

For example...

If you enjoy drawing maps in geography, one day you could study geography at university and then become a cartographer, someone who makes maps for people all around the world!





If you enjoy being creative in art, you could study interior design at university and then become a designer, someone who chooses colours, furniture and decorations to make a space look nice and comfortable.



On the next pages, you'll get the chance to explore these links yourself. You'll see how school subjects connect to university courses and then to jobs.

On the previous page, you'll need to match the subjects to the university courses and jobs they could lead to. Read these short descriptions to give you some clues.

UNIVERSITY COURSES

Mechanical engineering

Using maths, physics and engineering to design and build machines that help people do things faster and more easily.

Fashion

Learning how people choose and create clothes, shoes and accessories.

Sport and exercise science

The study of how the body functions during physical activity, including sports performance and general health.

Games design

Creating fun games that people like to play on computers, phones or video game consoles.

Performing arts

The study of drama, music and dance.

Zoology

The scientific study of the behaviour and biology of animals.

Creative writing

Using your imagination to tell stories, write poems or make up fun ideas with words.

Ancient history

Studying what life was like thousands of years ago, in ancient Egypt or Roman Britain for example.

JOBS

Writer

They create stories, books or articles by writing creatively. They use their imagination and language to tell stories or share ideas for others to enjoy.

Heritage manager

They look after special, historical places such as old castles. They protect these places from damage so people can enjoy visiting.

Game designer

They create video games or fun games to play. They come up with the ideas, design the characters and levels and make sure the game is exciting and fun to play.

Actor

They pretend to be a character in movies, TV shows or plays. They bring a story to life so that people watching can enjoy and understand the characters.

Zookeeper

They take care of animals in a zoo. They feed the animals, make sure they are healthy and keep their homes clean and safe.

Fashion designer

They use their technical skills and creative flair to develop designs for new clothing and accessories.

Physiotherapist

They help people feel better when they are hurt or have trouble moving. They give special exercises and treatments to help muscles and bones heal so that people can do everyday activities again.

Aerospace engineer

They design and build aeroplanes, rockets and space ships. They figure out how to make these vehicles fly safely and quickly, so people can travel far and explore space.
