### Bowls and History at the Victoria Bowling Club Thursday 31 August 2023 at 2.00pm

The Victoria Bowling Club has occupied its 'secret garden' site in Trafford Road, close to the centre of Norwich, since its foundation in 1870. After a century and a half as a gentlemen-only institution, in 2023 the Victoria's rules have fast-forwarded into the 21st Century, and the Club has welcomed its first women members. To celebrate this development, Richard Beck has arranged a session at the Club exclusively for the UEA Retirement Association. He will give a short illustrated talk on the history of the Victoria and its local area, after which there will be an opportunity for all to try out the game of lawn bowls with guidance from members of the Club. Refreshments will be provided in the Clubhouse, and parking is available. (For those travelling by public transport, the VBC is a 10 minute walk from Norwich Bus Station.)

The Victoria has always seen itself as 'a social club where we play bowls'. It doesn't take part in leagues or compete against other clubs. There is no 'dress code'; members bowl in ordinary clothes just as their predecessors always did. However, participants will need to wear flat shoes with no heels (guidance on which will be provided

nearer the time for those signing up to play).

#### Tuesday, 27 June 2023 (AGM) 'Restoration of Ketteringham Hall Icehouse' by Mary Parker

When part of Ketteringham Park was purchased for gravel extraction in the 1980s, the new owners had no idea that a tatty brick building on the edge of an old pit was an abandoned Victorian icehouse built for Sir John Boileau after he purchased the Hall in 1836. The reclaimed land was gifted to the parishes of Ketteringham and East Carleton and is now known as Ladybelt Country Park. This talk describes the restoration of the Grade II icehouse **The talk will be preceded by the AGM starting at 2pm.** 

#### Tuesday, 26 September 2023 'Why is growing food important for young people' by Matt Willer

Matt is the founder of the Papillon Project and the 2018 RHS School Gardening Champion of the Year. The aim of the Papillon Project is to work with secondary schools and sixth-form colleges in Norfolk to inspire young people to grow their own food for themselves and their local community.
