A Note from the Treasurer

Thank you all for renewing your 2022 memberships so promptly. The exercise is now completed and any members whose membership has lapsed do not receive this Renaissance. A few facts and figures (the figures in brackets are the comparable figures for 2020 as memberships were automatically renewed in 2021):

196 (234) members renewed by 31st December so it was only necessary to send 41 (33) reminders to jog memories. At 20th January membership is 202 (250) which represents 86 (100) individual members and 58 (75) joint members. As there was no membership renewal process in 2021 the decline in membership numbers is spread over two years but it is still a concern that we have very few new members joining to replace those that have lapsed. If you know someone who is eligible, a former colleague at UEA or the Research Park, please encourage them to join us and help the Association to continue to thrive.

TALKS

All talks begin at 2.15pm (unless otherwise stated) in the Costessey Centre, Longwater Lane, Costessey.

Our talks began again in September at a Covid-19 compliant Costessey Centre. Facemasks are required to enter the building and when moving around. There are hand santitizers, and chairs and tables are regularly cleaned. The chairs in the lecture room as spaced out to provide for social distancing. Tea and coffee is distributed in the lecture room rather than queuing at the kitchen hatches.

Since the October Renaissance, there have been three talks – all attended by about 30 members, about 30% less than before the pandemic. Gerald Brown spoke in October on Deltiology – the study of picture postcards; Diane Steele in November on Horsey Seals and the Canon Edward Carter in January 2022 on Four Years at Windsor Castle.

Norwich foodbank has been operating for over 10 years within the Trussell Trust network. At its core, it provides emergency food to local people in need but alongside this comes advice, support and other such help, all with the aim of ensuring the future is one where foodbanks are no longer needed.

Tuesday, 26 April 2022: "My Life as an International Press Photographer" by Malcolm Clarke

Malcolm Clarke has been a professional photographer for nearly 50 years, and has photographed many high-profile and important people around the world; as well as covering historic events, some of his pictures have won awards and become famous in their own right.

Tuesday, 24 May 2022: "From Subterranean Norwich to Upland Costessey" by Matt Williams

Matt Williams is a local geologist and historian who will show how the subsurface conditions have created the physical Norwich we know today. His aim is to help us to understand the place from ground level downwards.

Tuesday, 28 June 2022: "A Basque Journey" by Gary Smith

The Basque Country runs from Bayonne in south west France up to the Asturias in northern Spain. Gary will introduce us to the history and geography of the region, and including a 3-day train ride along the coast of northern Spain when he was working as a tour guide.

Tuesday, 27 Sept 2022:

"The Great Thorpe Railway Disaster 1874 Heroes, Victims, Survivors" by Phyllida Scrivens

Using extensive research, non-fiction narrative, informed speculation and dramatised events, Phyllida Scrivens pays tribute to the 28 men, women and children who died, revealing the personal stories behind the names, hitherto only recorded as a list.

The walks in November in Blickling Park had 25 participants and in December around Reepham had 20 participants, showing the reduction caused by the concerns about Covid, but did have socially distanced pub lunches with tables for six people. The short walk in January, after the omicron surge in Norwich, had 12 walkers who all had a pub lunch.

All walks start at **10.30am** (unless otherwise stated) but please arrive at the meeting place by at least 10.15am, especially if a pub lunch is planned in case we have to pre-order food. Car sharing would be appreciated. Walking boots or sturdy shoes are recommended.

These walks, and all other sporting and leisure activities, have inherent hazards associated with them. In spite of the safety of members of each walk being of paramount concern to its leader/leaders, accidents will occasionally occur. It is important therefore that, before taking part in any of our walks, every member appreciates that they each have an individual responsibility to be aware of possible hazards, and will each be expected to take all reasonable steps to minimise any potential for an accident to occur.

I.e. each walker takes part at his/her own risk.

Please ensure emails contain your name, contact telephone number, number of places and, where appropriate, the number of lunches required. This is particularly important for walks with pub lunches so that the managers may reserve appropriate space for us. This is a circular walk of approximately 4 miles, there may be an opportunity for a short cut. We start from outside the Recruiting Sergeant. The walk will be approximately 8.5 miles. Beeston Common can be muddy at any time of year so gaiters and boots are recommended. The climbs up and down Stone and Ingleborough Hills are short and sharp.

A group visit to Hoveton Hall House and Gardens has been booked for the afternoon of Wednesday 8 June, starting at 2.00pm and finishing at 5.00pm, price £20 a person. The visit includes a guided tour of the reception rooms of the Hall followed by refreshments. We are then welcome to explore the gardens at leisure.

The Regency Hall has been owned by the Buxton family since 1946 and in 2013 passed on to Harry and Rachel Buxton. The Hall was built between 1809 - 1812 and the design is attributed to Humphry Repton and his son John (and so a timely visit after the September 2021 talk on Humphry Repton!).

The Hall is well-known for its gardens, including the walled 'Spider Garden' (named after the wrought-iron spider's web design gate) and the old kitchen garden, a one-acre former Victorian walled kitchen garden which now also includes lawns and herbaceous borders, whilst still providing fruit, vegetables and herbs for the house. Hoveton Hall Gardens is a mix of formal and informal planting, over 15 acres of gardens and woodlands. Our visit in June should hopefully catch the displays of azaleas and rhododendrons. The gardens are home to an early 19th century glass house, one of only three of its type in the country.

Hoveton Hall have asked that final numbers and full payment be sent prior to the visit so it will not be possible to take any further bookings (or cancellations) after the closing date. 



Would you be happy to have Renaissance emailed to you in future?




Do you look at the UEARA website?




Events:

Number of events attended in total




Number of events regularly attended
