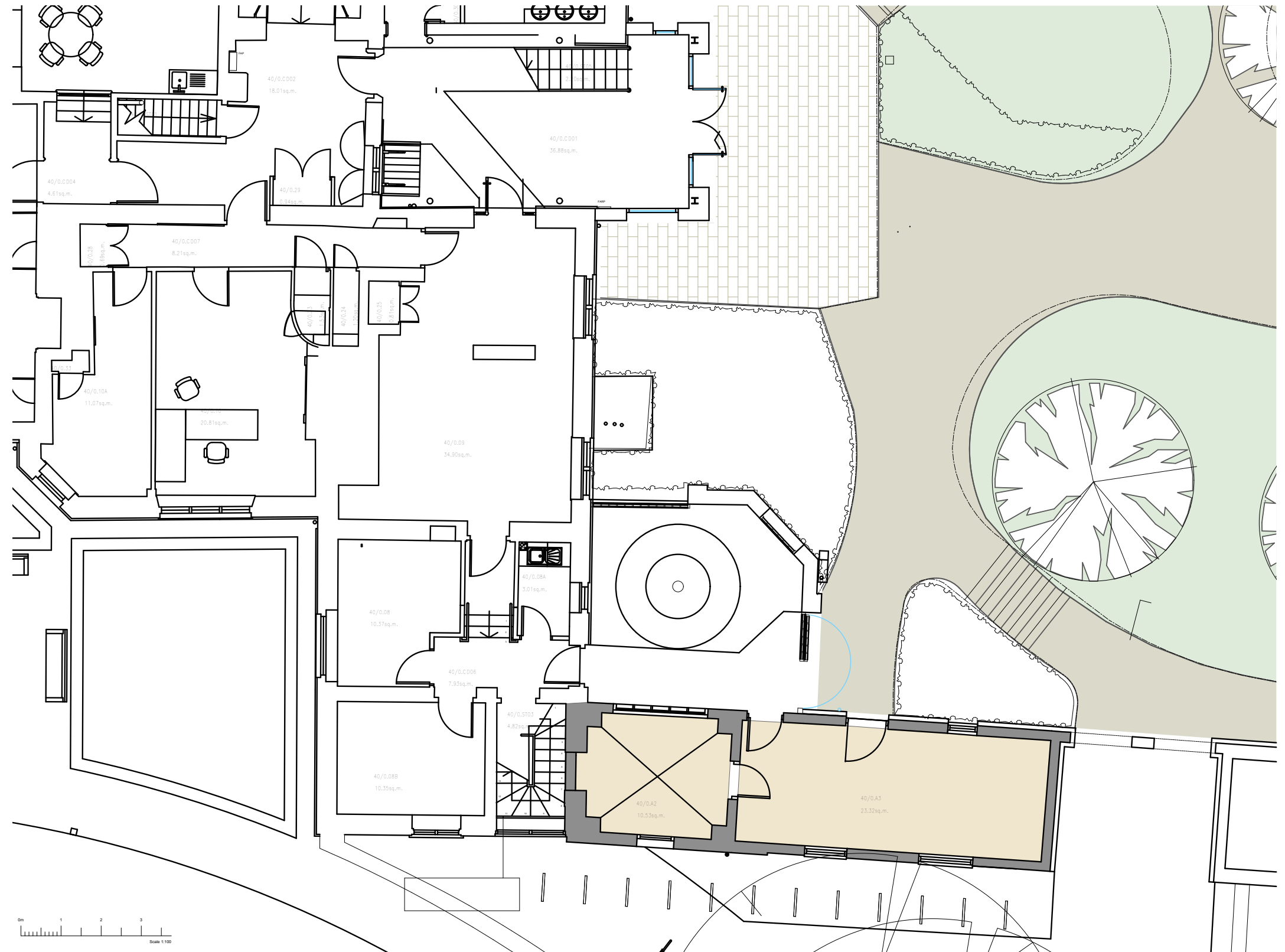

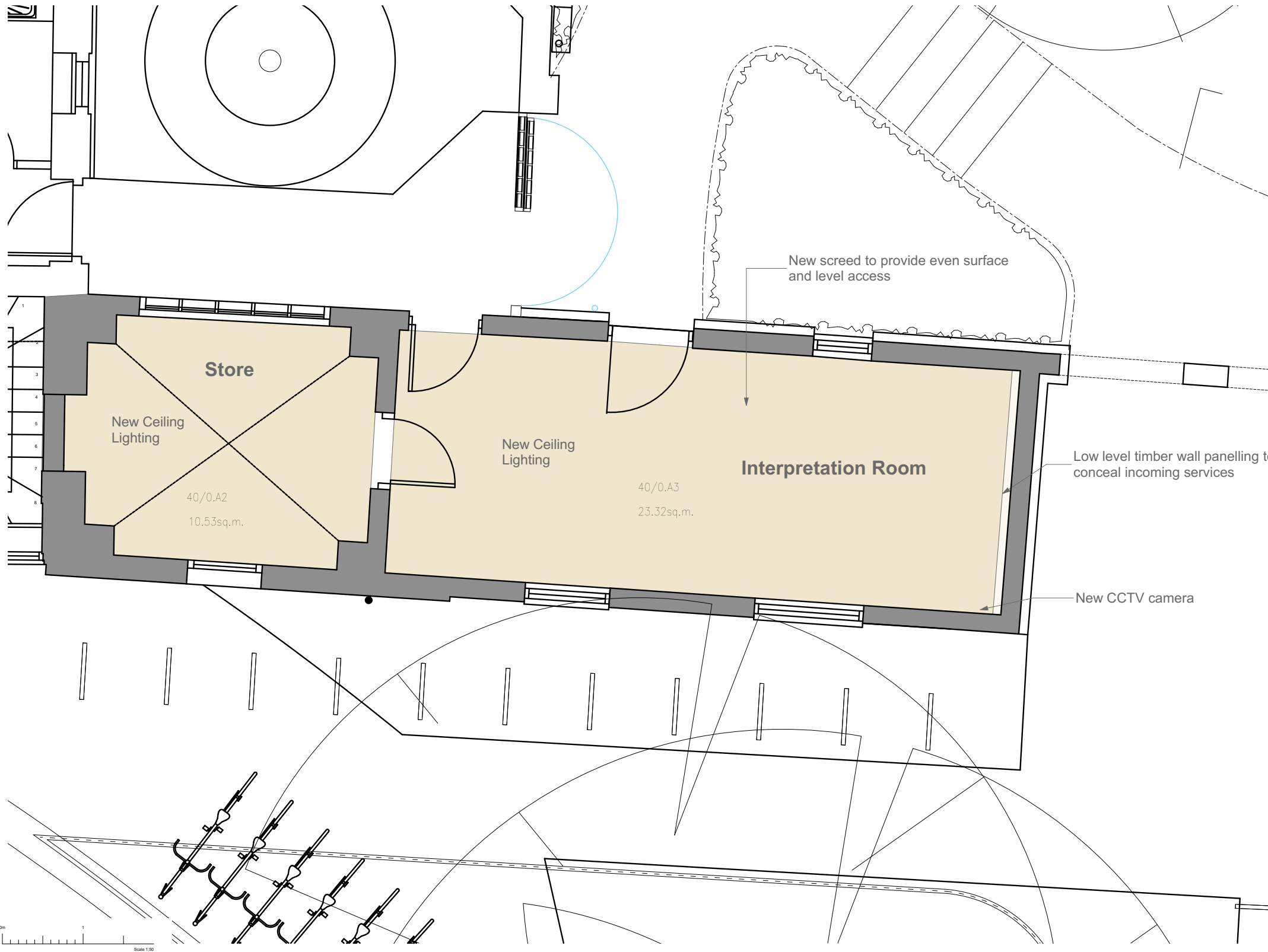

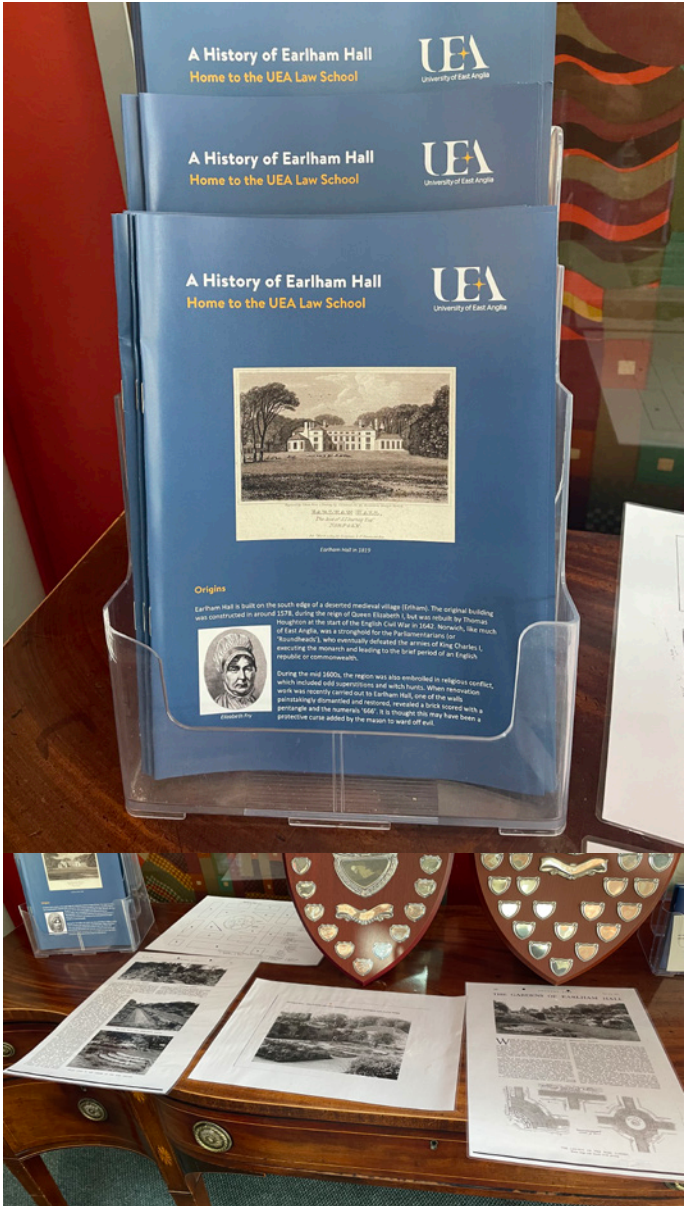

A leaflet about the History and recent refurbishment works of the Hall will be available in the main reception area of the Law School, allowing visitors to make further enquiries.

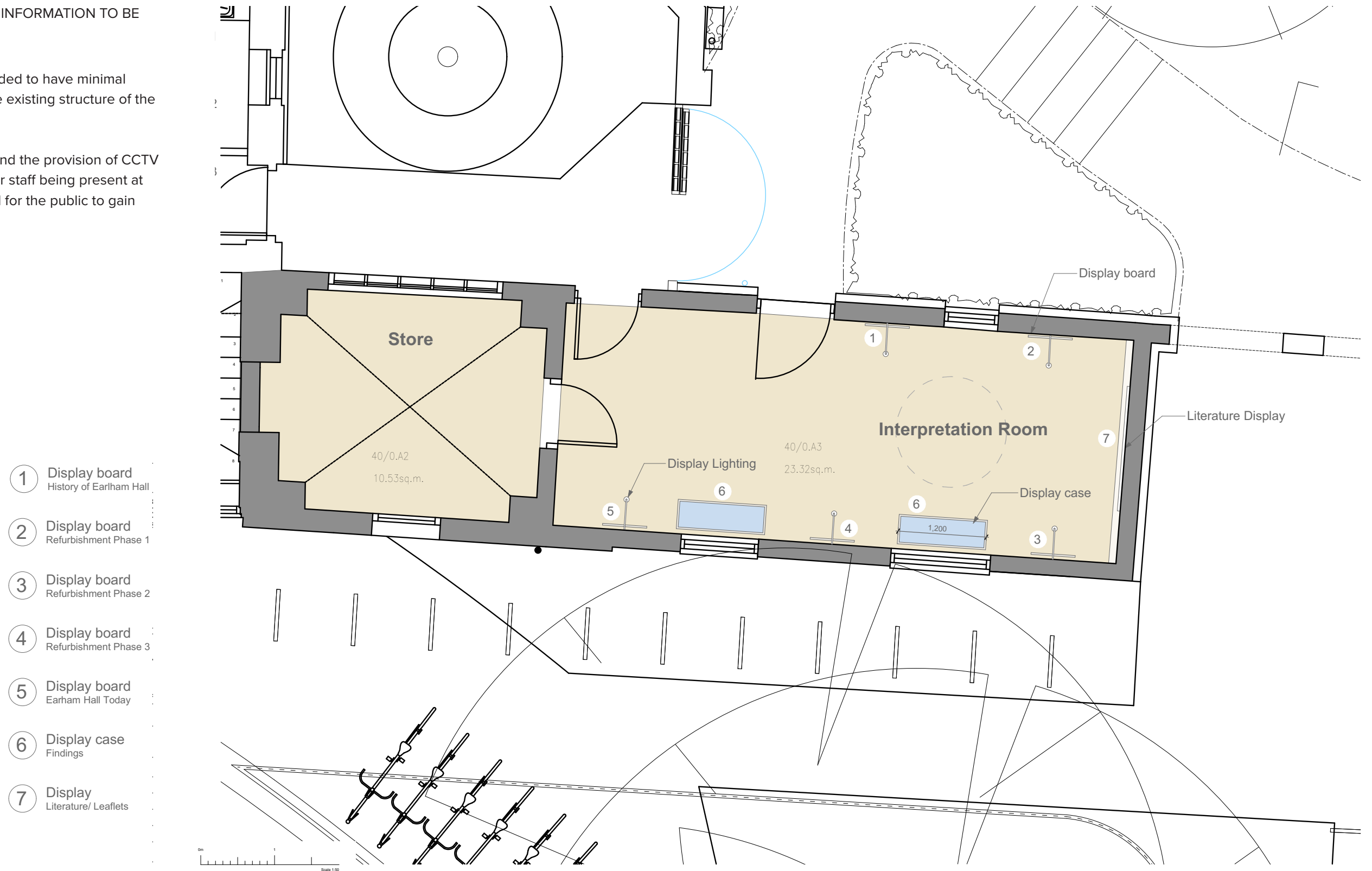


4.0 THE PROPOSAL

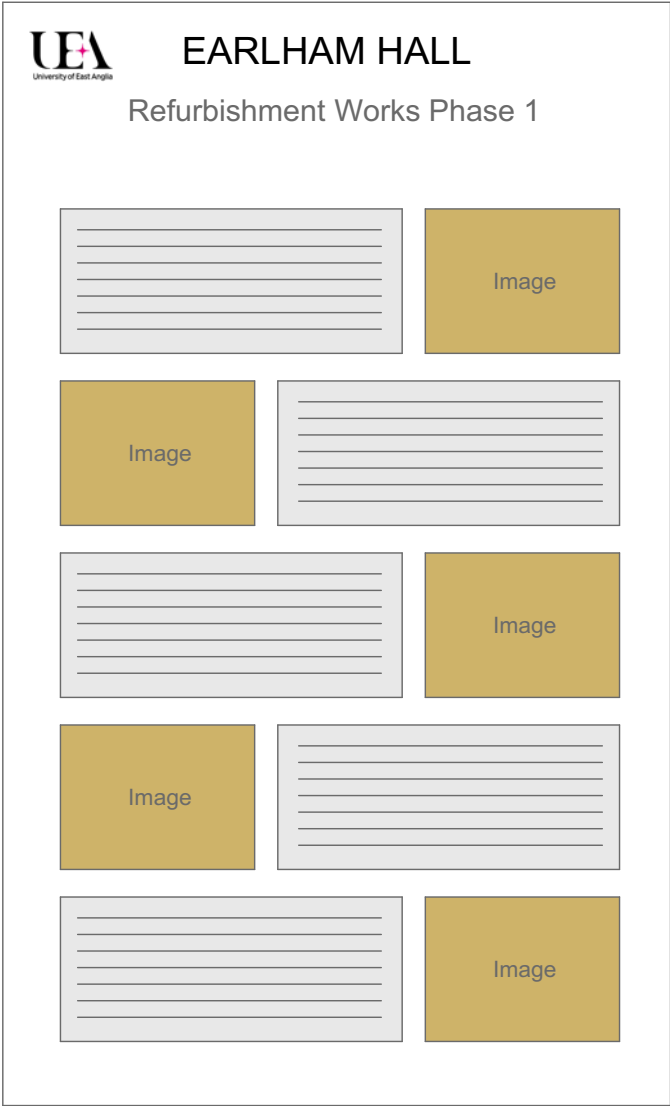

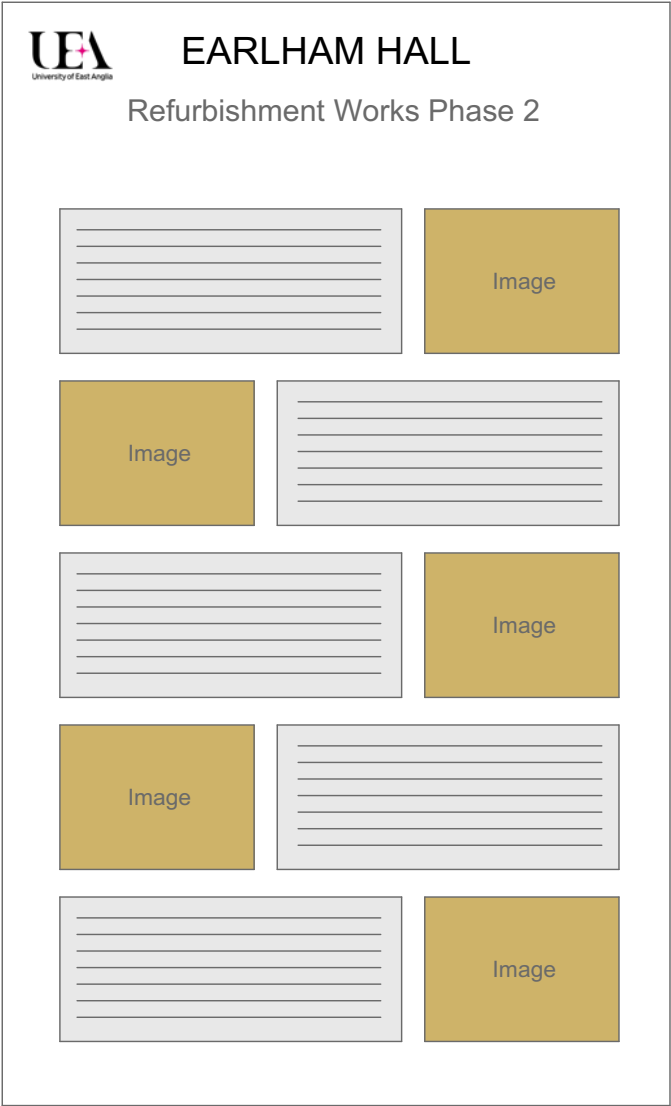

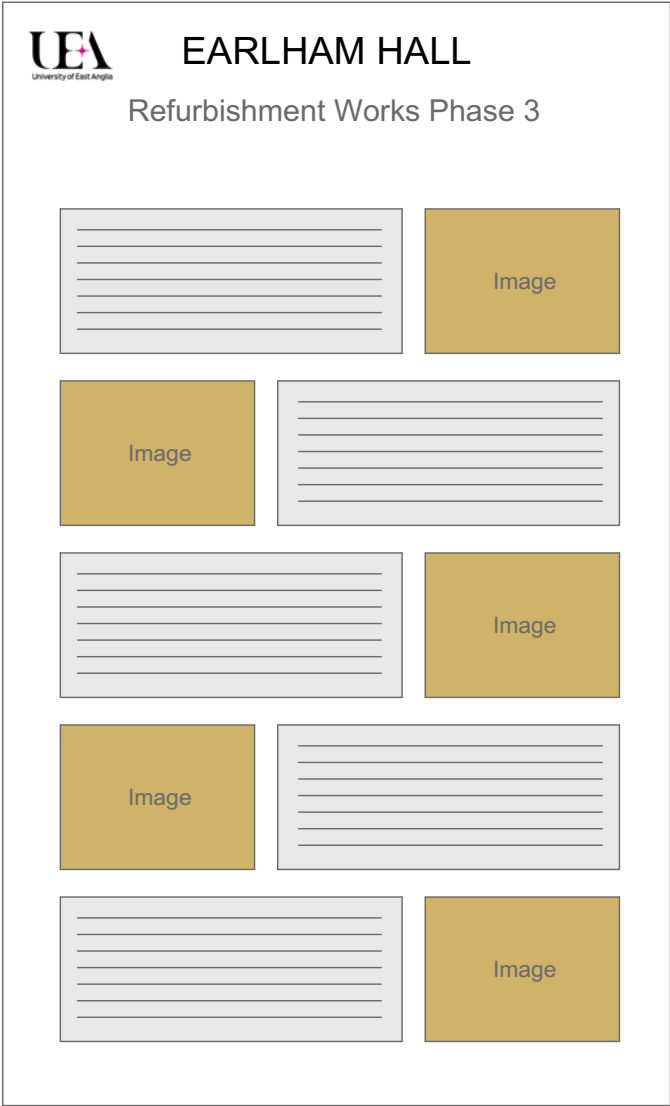

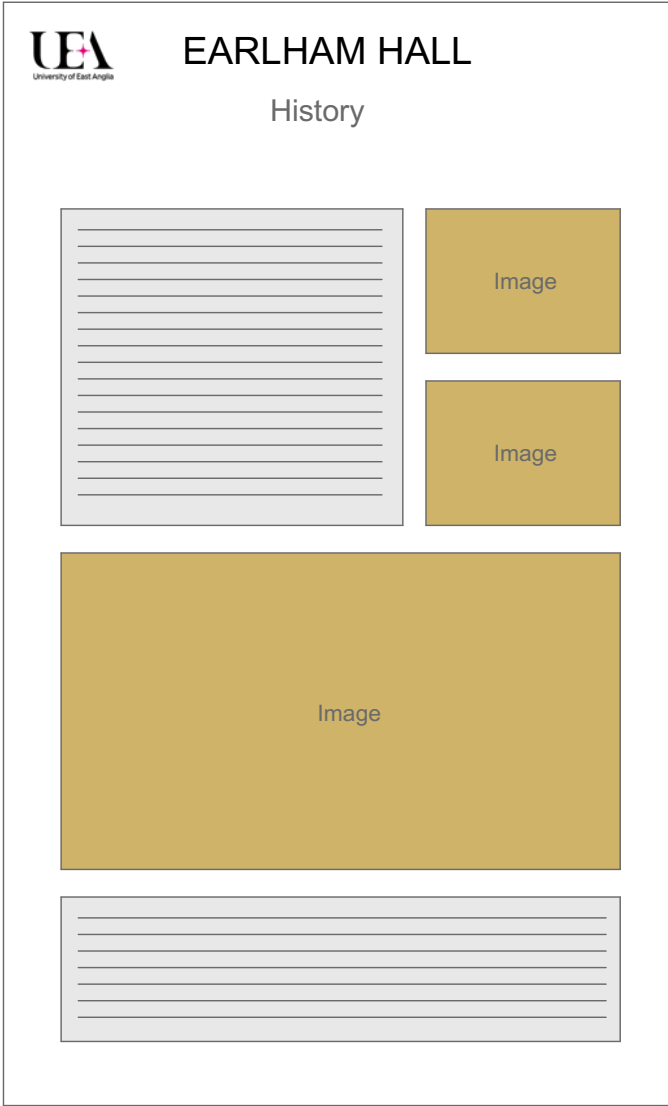

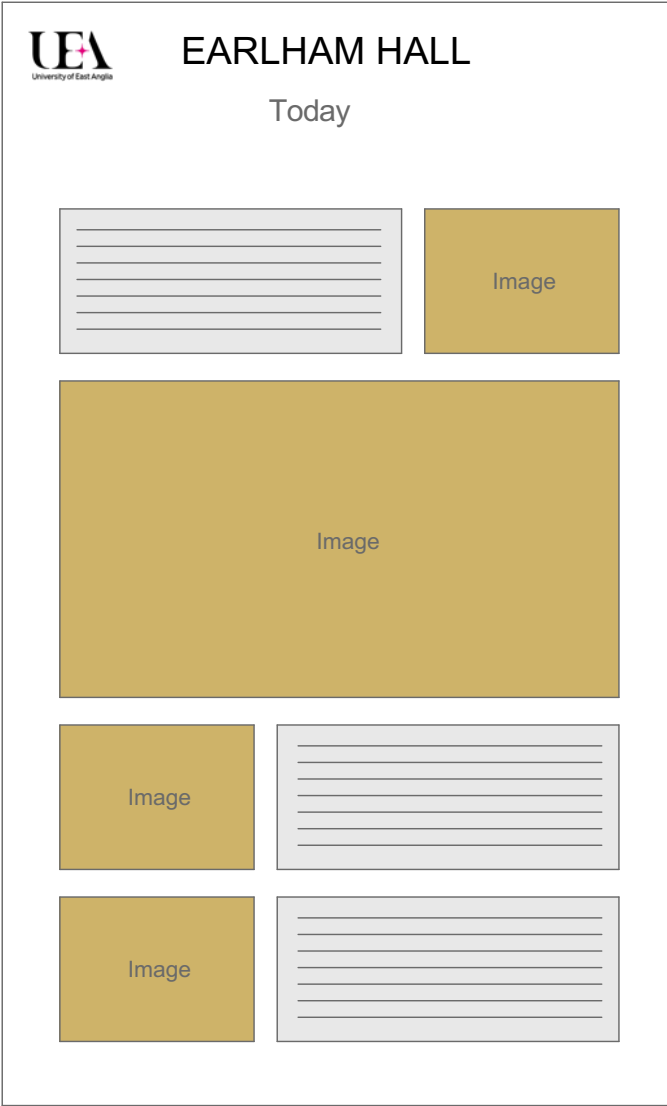

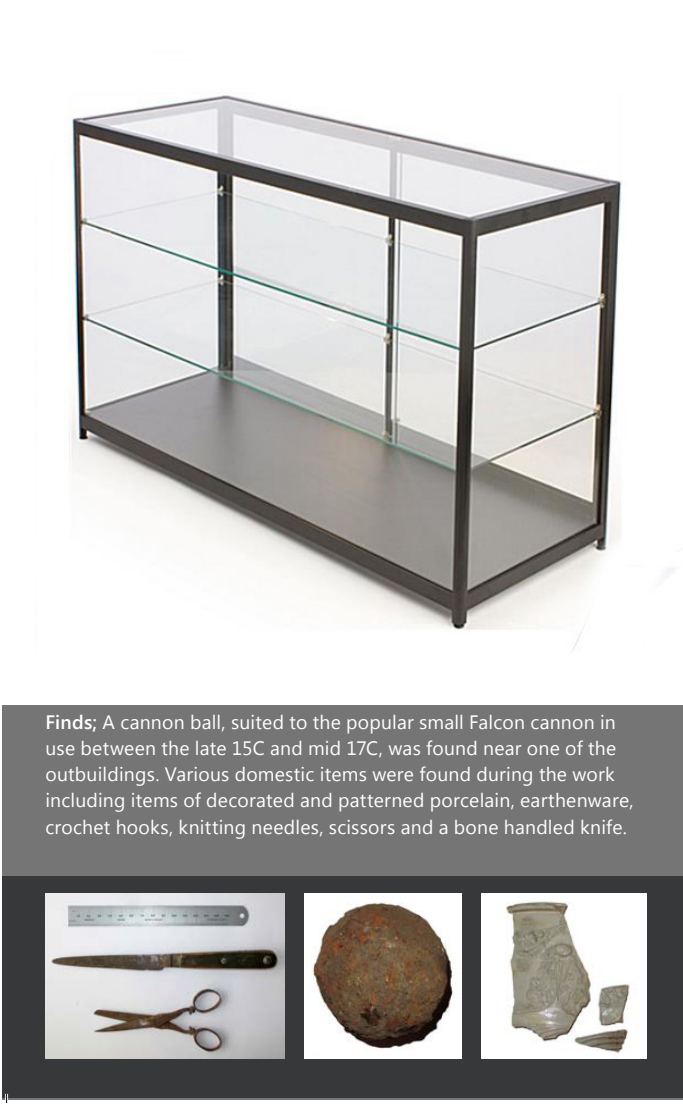
