Progress Update on Project ASSENT

Recruitment Drive

We have started to **invite people** to **take part** in **Project ASSENT Extension**.

We will have group discussion with:

- Researchers
- members of Research Ethics Committees
- Practitioners









They will tell us **what they think** about the **online guidance**. We will use the **suggestions** they give us to **make** the online **guidance better**.

We will speak with adults living with capacity and communication difficulties.

This includes adults living with:

- learning disabilities
- autism
- dementia
- aphasia after a stroke
- acquired brain injury
- and mental health conditions.

We will speak with adults living with capacity and communication difficulties on their own or with the support of someone who knows them well.

They will look at the section of the online guidance that is about **Practical supports** for **including people in research**.









Video Creation

We want to make video clips showing real-life examples of communication occurring between people with capacity and communication difficulties and those who know them best. We want to show how adults with understanding and communication difficulties communicate with others. Showing how adults with understanding and communication difficulties communicate with others will make the online guidance better and more useful.

We want to make video clips of 4 to 6 people with capacity and communication difficulties and those who know them best. The videos will show examples of how adults with capacity and communication difficulties express themselves.

For example:

- how they show agreement or positive feelings towards something.
- how they show disagreement or rejecting something.









The video clips will be about half a minute to one minute long.

The video clip will be included as examples in our online guidance.

The work of researchers at the **Open University helped us** to **put together** the **process** we need **to follow** to **create** the **videos**. The process we put together for creating videos will **make sure eveyone is protected**.

Our most recent paper:

A paper entitled "Lost voices. People with capacity and communication difficulties are under-represented in research" has been published









The paper points to the fact that adults with capacity and comunication difficulties are still being left out in research.

Coming out soon:

The **next paper** is entitled: "How are adults with capacity-affecting conditions and associated communication difficulties **included in ethically-sound research?** A documentary-based **survey of ethical review** and **recruitment processes** under the research provisions of the Mental Capacity Act (2005) for England and Wales".









The paper focuses on the process of including in research, people:

- with capacity-affecting conditions
- with communication difficulties
- who may be unable to give informed consent

The **paper** has been **submitted** to a reputable journal, known as '**BMJ Open**'.

BMJ Open has sent it back to us for corrections. **We** have **made** the **corrections** and **sent it back** to BMJ Open. We are **waiting** for their **final decision**.

In preparation:

We are now **preparing** the **next paper** entitled: "Current practice and values across multiple stakeholders about the inclusion of adults with impairments of capacity and/or communication within research: triangulation from a mixed methods study".

We plan to **submit** this paper to **BMJ**. **Further updates** to be provided **later**.

Research Ethics Committee members

We are happy to let you know that we will be sharing Project ASSENT findings with Research Ethics Committee (REC) members during their training days. REC members are teams who read research proposals and say whether it is safe and sound or not.

We will attend seven face-to-face training days. Each time, we will be sharing what we found out on project ASSENT with about 70 REC members. The training days for REC members will take place in:

- London
- York
- Manchester
- Birmingham and
- Reading.









Research Design Service Staff

We have also been invited to share what we found out in Project ASSENT with staff at the Research Design Service (RDS) East of England. The RDS are experts who support researchers to write good project plans and to submit it to those who can sponsor it.

The RDS covers six counties:

- Bedfordshire
- Cambridgeshire
- Essex
- Hertfordshire
- Norfolk and
- Suffolk.

We are still discussing possible dates but it is likely to be in May 2022. We are really looking forward to it.

Advisory Group









The Advisory Group for Project ASSENT extension continues from the original project.

It is made up of **people from different backgrounds**. This includes:

- representatives of the community of people living with disabilities. Some of whom may experience problems with understanding, communicating or expressing their ideas.
- people who **support** them
- representatives from the Health Research Authority
- and people who have served on research ethics committees.

The group will continue to help keep Project ASSENT relevant and accessible to all stakeholder groups. The group will meet twice during the project period of 12 months (October 2021-September 2022). The first meeting took place on Wednesday 2nd March 2022.









We are sharing the findings from Project ASSENT with other researchers online. We are sharing with researchers in Universities across England and Wales. The seminar titled 'Lost Voices' will also showcase the web-based guidance.
