17 LCR AND UNION

Inside Union House, you will walk through an open space called the Hive. Here you will find Unio, a full barista style coffee shop serving our own blend of coffee and snacks. Located upstairs is the Scholar's Bar, Grad Lounge, Grad Kitchen, bookable rooms and Union Office which is home to the Student Union staff and officers. Adjacent to the Hive is the LCR which is a live music venue and nightclub run by the Union of UEA Students.

THE STREET

The Street is a central part of life at UEA, bringing together key services, everyday essentials, and student support in one easy-to-navigate space. Visitors will find the UEA Shop, ideal for food shopping, household items and fresh bakery goods, alongside a Post Office. Next door, there's a 24/7 launderette, offering convenient access for students living on campus.

It's also home to several helpdesks and support points, such as CareerCentral and the Student Information Zone (SIZ), where our friendly staff are on hand to offer guidance on everything from course queries to wellbeing and finance.

14 LIBRARY

A well-stocked library with over 800,000 books and journals on its shelves. Students are able to make use of the group study zones or rooms, the PCs or the bookable individual study spaces if they need to get their head down.

13 LECTURE THEATRE BLOCK

The traditional lecture theatre building is home to four tiered seating lecture theatres located next to the library in the heart of campus. The largest lecture theatre, called LT1, seats an impressive 510 people; one of the largest capacity lecture theatres in the Norwich area.

THE SQUARE

As the social hub of the campus, the Square is a great place to relax and meet friends, particularly in warmer weather. There are a number of food outlets around the square, including the Student Union Bar.

16 CAMPUS KITCHEN

Whether you're looking for breakfast, lunch, dinner or just a snack, Campus Kitchen includes three different food outlets; Zest, Blend and Vista, so you can choose from a variety of options.

TEACHING WALL

The architecturally unique Teaching Wall was designed by Denys Lasdun and sits at the heart of the original campus. Half of the building is currently undergoing renovation work and will be home to new state of the art science research labs.

9 LAWRENCE STENHOUSE BUILDING

Named after Lawrence Stenhouse who left a lasting impact on teachers and the theory and practice of secondary education, the building is currently home to the school of Psychology, Social Work and Sociology.

8 ZICER BUILDING

The Zicer Building houses multiple seminar rooms for all faculties to make use of. However, it is primarily home to the school of Global Development.

52 THOMAS PAINE STUDY CENTRE

Named after the locally born philosopher, the Thomas Paine Study Centre is home to the Norwich Business School and makes an impressive venue for plenary conference sessions.

11 ELIZABETH FRY BUILDING

The Elizabeth Fry Building was opened in 1995 and remains one of the most energy efficient buildings on campus. The building includes teaching spaces, meeting rooms and office space. The School of Economics is based in this building.

43 NORWICH MEDICAL SCHOOL

This building is a key location for our medical students and a range of teaching and problem-based learning spaces. Medicine courses also use the facilities located within the Bob Champion Research and Education Building, which is situated a 20 minute walk away on Norwich Research Park West, near the Norfolk and Norwich Hospital.

57 JULIAN STUDY CENTRE

The building has a variety of seminar rooms and a lecture theatre used by all schools across the university. The ground floor foyer offers a café to students and visitors.

60 NEW SCIENCE BUILDING

The 60th building on campus, NewSci is home to multi-use science labs over three floors, and nine large seminar rooms on the ground floor.

7 SAINSBURY CENTRE

Turn off here to visit our stunning on-campus museum, the Sainsbury Centre for Visual Arts. One of the most prominent university art galleries in Britain, and a major national centre for the study and presentation of art.

10 QUEEN'S BUILDING

Queen's Building is the home to various teaching and simulation facilities used by the school of Health Sciences. It also offers a Lecture Theatre on the first floor.

33 SPORTSPARK

The Sportspark is open to students, staff and members of the local community and hosts a variety of facilities including an olympic-sized swimming pool, running track, climbing wall and gym.

58 THE ENTERPRISE CENTRE

Home to multiple modern facilities including seminar rooms, a large lecture theatre and versatile foyer, the multi-award winning Enterprise Centre offers businesses and academia a fully accessible creative space to collaborate and nurture ideas. The Enterprise Centre also offers an onsite café for refreshments and event hospitality.

40 EARLHAM HALL

Built in 1642 and nestled within Earlham Park, Earlham Hall is a historic country house that is now home to the Law School.

ACCOMMODATION

23 TOURS ZONE

103, 125 - 132 EN SUITE CAMPUS

Much of our en suite campus accommodation is located centrally, in attractive modern buildings, close to amenities and study spaces. Similar rooms grouped in 6 to 13-person flats sharing a kitchen/diner are based in Britten, Browne, Colman, Kett, Paston and Victory Houses. Each has its own en suite shower, toilet and wash basin.

There are fully accessible bedrooms with large wet rooms within 12-person flats in Britten and Colman Houses. Nelson Court and Constable Terrace offer rooms mainly in 10-person houses arranged on three floors, with a large kitchen and dining area on the ground floor.

133 - 135 EN SUITE HICKLING HOUSE, BARTON HOUSE AND CROME HOUSE

Another option for you could be our premium options including Hickling House, Barton House and Crome House, which offer en suite accommodation with shared living space.

Located on campus, each flat has a combined kitchen/diner and lounge area, providing opportunities for residents to socialise. As well as en suite facilities (shower, toilet, and basin) each study bedroom has ample storage.

109 - 123 UEA VILLAGE

If you would prefer a quieter accommodation option, set slightly further away from the centre of campus, our University Village offers 715 en suite rooms. Rooms have an en suite 'pod' containing a shower, toilet and wash basin, and are grouped in four, six or eight person flats, each with kitchen/diner.

These are attractive options to students because of their sense of community within the village.
